## Fighting for a Better Life

Members of the Florida Education Association work hard to ensure our public schools are places where students' imaginations can soar, and each and every student is provided the tools and lessons to make their dreams come true.

Unfortunately, rather than working with the teachers and education staff professionals who educate Florida's children to make that dream a reality, antipublic education politicians have tried to silence our collective voice. But those politicians who oppose the rights of teachers and staff to have a union are finding out their plan to attack us is failing. Already, more than 100,000 educators have made the switch from payroll deduction to another form of dues payment.

What the politicians don't understand is that educators have had enough; we are coming together to fight for a better life for our students and ourselves. We stand united to ensure lawmakers will

live up to their mandate in the Florida Constitution that every student has a right to a "high quality system of free public schools." We are in every ZIP code in Florida and we are speaking with one voice to say that, after two decades of disinvestment in public schools, we are ushering in a decade of progress.

#### We Believe:

Florida's neighborhood public school students deserve: to attend schools that are fully staffed with highly qualified and certified teachers; schools with small class sizes that allow for one-on-one attention; schools that are safe and healthy; schools with full-time registered nurses, counselors, and mental health professionals; schools that focus on real learning and authentic assessment; schools where students' unique needs are met and every student excels, no matter their race, income, ZIP code or ability.

## We are calling on lawmakers to:

- Expand the financial investments in our schools and allocate sufficient funds to fairly compensate all school employees. By investing just \$1,000 more per student each year into the Florida Education Finance Program, we can ensure our students have access to a world class public education and get one step closer to moving Florida's teacher salary ranking into the top 10 instead of the current #50 ranking.
- » Fully fund Public Education Capital Outlay (PECO) so every school is free of mold, every water fountain is free of lead, and every school has working air-conditioning and proper ventilation.
- » Ensure that students and educators are kept safe and learning progress continues.
- » Help address our educator shortage by allowing qualified, experienced teachers to earn multi-year contracts.
- » Protect academic freedom for all students and teachers in PreK-12, state colleges and universities.
- » Waive fees for certification renewals, add-on certifications and certification tests for teachers and those in teacher preparation programs.

- » Promote and fund pathways to teacher licensure for current education staff professionals at no cost to the educator.
- » Continue extended DROP program to all educators.
- » Restore previous Cost of Living Adjustments for current and future retirees.
- » Fund a full-day PreK program in "opportunity zones" of high poverty.
- » Revise statutes related to Required Local Effort to maintain current taxation rates.
- » Address the housing and property insurance crisis in Florida that is keeping families, teachers and students priced out of living where they work or attend school.
- » Prioritize developmentally appropriate, teacherled assessments and learning over mandated standardized tests.
- » Respect the rights of people to make decisions locally.
- » Respect the constitutionally protected right to collective bargaining.
- » Safeguard families from unaccountable private and charter schools that profit off our children.
